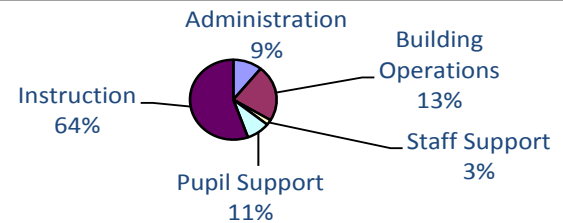

The school administrators make presentations to our School Board about what is happening in their schools. You can find the Board of Education's meeting dates in this calendar to attend to hear the presentations.

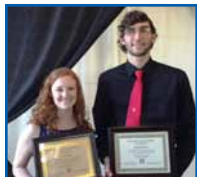


Mr. Harper, (PJH Assistant Principal) and Mr. Preston (PJH Principal) presented to the Franklin Local Board of Education during their November meeting.

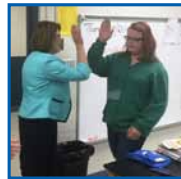

The Board

The Franklin Local School District Board of Education encourages school staff and all citizens of the school district to attend its meetings. Informed and involved citizens are one of the keys to providing a quality education for all students. The board members appreciate your interest and support as they strive to provide our students with the best education possible.

Board Formation

All five members of the board reside in the Franklin Local School District. Members are nominated by petition and elected on a non-partisan ballot at a regular November election in an odd-number year. Board members serve four-year terms. Consecutive terms of office are allowed. The board elects a president and vice president each year at the organizational meeting in January.

Functions of the Board

The Board's major responsibilities are to set policy and oversee the implementation of the policy by the superintendent and staff.

Other responsibilities include the following: adopt plans and set goals for the district; select and employ a superintendent and treasurer, and evaluate them; monitor the overall fiscal operation of the school district; consider the recommendations of the superintendent regarding policy, personnel, curriculum, and other matters; evaluate the schools' effectiveness; and inform the public about the progress and needs of the schools. Board members represent the interests of all citizens regarding the education of their students.

Board Meetings

Single members of a board of education have no authority to act except when together in session at a regular, special, or emergency meeting of the board. The board conducts all of its business in open public meetings. Announcements of all meetings are made in advance and area newspaper representatives are notified. The Board meetings are on the third Thursday of each month except in January, when the meeting by law, must be held by January 15. Board meetings are held in the lower level of the Administration Building in Duncan Falls at 6:30 p.m. The meeting dates and times are listed in the attached Calendar of Events.

Citizen Participation

Your views and questions are important to the board members. Anyone wishing to speak is asked to sign the visitor's register, which is available beside the entry door to the meeting room. The register, which requests name, home address, organization represented (if applicable), and subject to be discussed, must be completed before a visitor will be recognized. Visitors will be recognized by the board president and allowed to make their statements. Comments are limited only to matters of general concerns. If a question can be answered immediately, it will be. If time is needed to study the issue, the concern will be addressed at a later date.

Executive Session

Ohio "Sunshine Law" permits the board an executive session to discuss certain personnel matters, the sale or purchase of property, pending imminent court action, negotiations with employee associations, security arrangements, and any other matters required by law or state statute to be confidential. Ohio law requires all voting to be done in public session. The board cannot take action in executive session.
