Graduation Requirements

Beginning last school year students were required to not only obtain their 20 credits to graduate, but to also score a minimum of 18 points on their end of course exams. These tests are given at the end of each school year to test a student's proficiency in each content class. From their freshman year through the end of their junior year take 7 tests with the opportunity of scoring up to 5 points on each test.

In order to meet the requirements a student must have 4 points on math and English tests, and 6 points combined on science and social studies tests. Students have the chance to retake tests they did not score well on in an effort to reach the 18 point requirement.

Expanding Elective Offerings

For the 2018-2019 school year we expanded our elective course offerings to students. We had great success with last school years' classes! Teachers were very eager to create new courses for students; adding to personal finance, astronomy, art through history, and yearbook, we are now also offering geography, literature through film, and anatomy.
